Recently, I read a statement from an undocumented source that exploded from the page and will not go away. Allow me to share it with you:

"If God is your co-pilot - swap seats!"

Believing that we are captain of our own soul, we often *fly* into forbidden turbulence, thinking that God is seated beside us as "first officer" only *in case of emergency*. It is when we do not allow God to be in charge, that we leave our chartered course.

As a sheep-herder, David could easily surrender the course of his life to God, expressing it this way:

"The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures;

He leads me beside quiet waters. He restores my soul;

He guides me in the paths of righteousness for His name's sake.

Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I fear no evil,
