MEMORIAL DAY

This coming Monday we will all be observing Memorial Day. It is a holiday in which the nation takes the time to remember all those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for this country by giving their lives in battle or service. We may have family cookouts or spend the day at the beach, but we should not forget those who have fallen protecting our freedoms here in America and abroad. I will spend this Memorial Day weekend in New York City where I will have the opportunity to
