I have always loved Thanksgiving Day. Not just because I love Dallas Cowboys football, pumpkin pie and turkeys filled with dressing, but because it is a time to reflect and be thankful for all that God has given to me and my family. I know I'm not the only one who loves Thanksgiving.

Did you know that Thanksgiving is not just an American pastime? Other countries such as Brazil, Germany, Ghana, Nigeria and South Korea also have their thanksgivings. For instance, India celebrates a harvest festival in most regions throughout the country.

Canada celebrates a thanksgiving in October. The Chinese Festival of "Chung Ch'ui" is hallowed and on this day many in China eat moon cakes (small yellow cakes) to celebrate the harvest moon.

The Victory and Homeland Thanksgiving Day is celebrated in Croatia on August 5th. However, it is more than a Thanksgiving holiday. Thanksgiving celebrations are also not unique to the modern era. The cornucopia is traced back to the ancient Greeks and Romans. It comes from Greek mythology and was said to be a "horn of plenty" that was given by the Greek god Zeus. And the ancient Egyptians had a thanksgiving feast in honor of Min, the god of harvest and fertility.

In the Bible we read of the Jewish feast of Sukkot (or the Feast of Booths/Tabernacles) that was observed during the harvest season. It is one of the three great pilgrimage festivals on which the Israelites would make a pilgrimage to the Temple in Jerusalem (also Passover and Pentecost). The pilgrims would campout in tents and tell stories of the time the Israelites spent in the wilderness awaiting entrance into the Promised Land.

What a wonderful blessing to have a day of thanksgiving each year! And how blessed we are that we live in a nation that allows this sacred and hallowed tradition. Hebrews 12:28-29 says, "Therefore, since we receive a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe; for our God is a consuming fire."
