March 17, 2019 Some Visitors! Tritheism Is Sneaking Into The Church

This week we begin our theme, or topical study, for the next few weeks in this bulletin space. We are attempting to shed light on the role, work, and personality of the Holy Spirit. Clearly there are hundreds of Scriptures, in both the Old Testament and New Testament, we need to consider. However, before we attempt to decipher those contexts we need to see the common arguments.

For the sake of time, I do not want to argue about equality of God. The Holy Spirit is equal to God because HE IS GOD (Genesis 1:1-3, 26-27, Matthew 3:16-17, Matthew 28:19, John 14:16-18, John 16:7, Acts 5:3-4, 9, Romans 8:16-17, Romans 15:30, II Corinthians 1:21-22, I Peter 1:2). However, there are two distinct arguments made about whether God is one God (3-in-1) or whether He is three Gods working as one God (1-in-3).

Tritheism is the belief that there are three distinct, powerful Gods, who form a triad or Trinity. Those who hold this view believe the three maintain "Godhood" both individually and collectively. They teach that there are three Gods with separate powers and roles, yet are all supreme beings (i.e. Father = God #1, Son = God #2, & Holy Spirit = God #3). They believe that all three are working together in perfect unity, therefore, there is no contradiction when God's word says that it is only one God.

In this respect, Tritheism differs from Dualism (which typically adheres to two Divine powers in a state of conflict). Tritheism is embraced by many Christian denominations, which may be why it is sneaking into the church. One of the most notable professors of this theology is the LDS faith (Mormons). Within our fellowship (COC) I've heard some say that "there is a hierarchical system within the Godhead." This would allow a head God (Father), a lesser God (Jesus), and a baby God (HS).

Why is Tritheism being taught? It is my opinion that this viewpoint is becoming more prominent in an effort to squelch the charismatic side of the church. This teaching resonates as a fear tactic, rather than from an honest study of Scripture. *-continued inside-*
