The Work of the Holy Spirit in the Church

...leaders to preach and teach the truth. As we will see in future articles, this is not always a supernatural process, but the natural result of one who is walking in the Spirit.

6) The Holy Spirit guided teaching (8:26-40, 9:31, 13:52, 18:25). These brief examples listed are just a handful of specific cases where we know the Holy Spirit aided in teaching. Just like in preaching, when we are full of the Holy Spirit, God's words should be spoken. We should seek to reveal God's will, not our own (II Timothy 3:16-17).

7) The Holy Spirit strengthened the disciples (4:8, 4:31, 6:3-5, 7:55, 9:17-19, 9:31, 11:24, 13:9, 13:52, 15:32, 16:35). Clearly the Holy Spirit fulfilled one main objective, set forth by Christ, to comfort and strengthen the disciples (John 14:15-31).

One additional thought, not categorized above, is the fact that the Holy Spirit compelled some men to become overseers in the church and sent some out to the work of church planting (Acts 20:28, 13:2). Are those things still happening in the church today? If so, what can we know about it? Who is behind it? Think about it. And we'll take a look at the book of Romans next week. Have a great week!
