The Holy Spirit Gives Spiritual Gifts

There is little doubt that the work of the Holy Spirit is often confusing, unless one rightly divides the word of God (II Timothy 2:15). Of the most interesting (and difficult) topics to understand is the work of the Holy Spirit. The Bible clearly teaches that one of the purposes of the Holy Spirit is/was to give spiritual gifts (Romans 12:3-8, I Corinthians 1:5 -7, 12-13, I Peter 4:8-11, Ephesians 4:7-12, Hebrews 10:4). We have already noted in this series that the Holy Spirit seals us to the day of redemption (II Corinthians 1:21-22, Ephesians 1:13-14, Ephesians 4:30), but what special gift(s) does it intend to bestow upon a child of God until that day comes?

It is evident that there is fruit that should flow from the life of a believer through the Holy Spirit (John 15:1-8). Paul says, "The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law" (Galatians 5:22-23). That fruit will enable us to use a Godgiven talent to bless the kingdom. Every Christian has at least one special ability/talent (Matthew 25) that will enable us to do good works, even to the "least" of those among us. Your spiritual gift(s) can be developed and nurtured to shine light into dark places (Matthew 5:16).

We must not confuse the temporary supernatural gifts of the Holy Spirit (limited to the work of the early church) and the natural gifts of the Holy Spirit (provided to all believers). The temporary supernatural gifts of the Spirit were for the purpose of bringing attention to the fact that Jesus IS the Christ (Mark 16:20, I Corinthians 12:8-10, 13:8). It is clear that only be apostles could pass on these supernatural gifts (Acts 2, 8, 10, 19, Romans 1:11, I Corinthians 13, 14:32, II Timothy 1:6) but once the apostles died off this ability to pass on supernatural gifts ceased. This leaves only the natural fruit of the Holy Spirit that dwells inside of a believer, who has become a personal temple of the Lord (I Corinthians 6:19-20) ~continued inside~
