October 6, 2019 Second Welcome Visitors! Led By The Holy Spirit

The Jews really struggled with letting go of the law? Why? It is so comfortable knowing that everything you need to know can be found in one place. It limits you and, in a way, it limits God. People would often rather be led by the law than by the Spirit. I realize it may not be a popular view (but it's true) that God does what God wants. He is not bound by any limitations. It is true that He is not slack concerning His promises (**II Peter 3:9**), and is described as unchanging (**Malachi 3:6**), but if He wants to remove, revoke, or supersede a previous statement... He is God! He can do it! If you don't believe that do a study of Bible covenants and how many times God uses the term "forever" in Scripture. He does what He wants and offers no apology.

Have you read the book of Job? It is the story of a man who was raised on a "black and white" scenario: Live right and get rewarded. What did he do when his world turned upside down? He spent days and hours debating it (**Job 3-37**). He defended himself. He defended his children. He even defended God! How did God answer Job and his friends? Basically He said, "I am God. You are not." THE END.

If you tell me there is a grey area I might just run to one end or the other to pick a side! We choose black or white. We have no middle ground. I used to hear an old preacher say, "It's dangerous in the middle of the road. Choose the right or choose the left. Anything else and you'll get run over!" But, Paul is writing to the Galatians so that they would release their grip on the law (right or left). Galatians 5:18 says, "But if the Spirit is leading you, you are not under the law." (NCV)

Listen carefully to what Paul says. We live under a new law where we do not always have the luxury of knowing what to do for every single decision life throws at us! Sometimes the Bible is silent on certain matters. What then? We pray for wisdom (James 1:5-6). We study God's Word (II Timothy 3:16-17). We ponder what Jesus would do (I Peter 2:21-25). Then, we let the Spirit lead us and guide us to do it.
