# REVER GROW OLD

A friend who knows how much I love history suggested that I go with him to see a documentary entitled, "They Shall Not Grow Old." It is composed of original film footage from the war that has been restored and edited for modern audiences. It follows the troops from England in their training, combat and eventual return from war. The narration basically consists of the reading of journals, archives and other materials of the original participants. The movie was released in 2018, the centennial anniversary of the end of World War I, but was re-released for a special viewing in 2019.

As I was watching, I was thinking about the title and how the men's lives were essentially frozen in time. One way this was true is the fact that I was seeing the young men (referred to in the movie as, "kids, six-teen and seventeen years old) marching across the screen one hundred-plus years after they actually marched across the fields. The second, and perhaps most obvious way they did not grow old was that many of them were killed at that young age. Scene after scene of macabre images flashed across the screen, bringing home the horror of war.

At the end of the movie, during a segment to show how it was made, director Perter Jackson mentioned a group of soldiers that were shown in special detail. He then went on to explain that, at the time of the filming, many of the men were essentially thirty minutes away from their deaths.

As I had anticipated seeing the movie, and as I watched the movie, my thoughts drifted to a hymn I grew up singing, and a story that still stirs my soul. The story involves Tom Holland, a well-known gospel preacher and a talented song-leader. As he grew older and participated in "gospel singings," he would select or be asked to lead the song, "Never Grow Old." He would ask the congregation to sing the song enthusiastically, but with special emphasis on the word, "never" – as in:

"Never grow old, never grow old! In a land where we'll never grow old!

Never grow old, never grow old! In a land where we'll never grow old!"

Participating in such a rendition of that was powerful, and obviously meaningful to me. In my mind, I can still see and hear brother Holland lead that song.

I think now of the reality behind that hymn. Heaven awaits us. The eternal God will be there—there will be no mourning, crying or pain (Revelation 21:4); there will be night there (Revelation 22:5).

And, we will never grow old!
