Nostalgia, Reconnecting & Forgiveness

One of the interesting, yet logical (when you ponder it) phenomena surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic is that of people longing to connect with people from their past. In many cases, they have done so by social media, phone calls, or by written correspondence. The persons involved may have been parents and children, ex-husbands and wives, or friends who had drifted apart.

Some of them have spent much of the quarantine time with each other— have met one another for a "social distance" visit in a backyard or park, talked on the phone, texted, or chatted on Facebook. Some relationships have been renewed that appear to be permanently repaired.

The process begins with an escape from the bad news of the current pandemic—maybe the sickness or death of someone we know. We think about the "old days" and wonder, "Whatever happened to so-and-so?" Or, maybe when an article details the death of someone who cannot be with family or friends because of their condition in an ICU, we are startled into thinking about relationships that could, and maybe should be still active. Maybe we begin to miss a friendship and wonder if that relationship can be renewed. Once the remembrance has begun, a search is made for a mailing address, phone number, or email address. Then, it is not too long past the obtaining of such information that a message is formed in the mind and the "water is tested,"—it is sent. Maybe the reconnecting begins immediately, with the relationship "picking up where it left off." Or, maybe it took a while for the friends, or family to get used to one another again. Then, there is the possibility of a problem that halted the friendship in the first place—maybe a lie or betrayal, but "something." If that was the case, additional steps must be taken. The problem must be addressed by both parties, and in order for the relationship to resume, forgiveness must take place, possibly on both sides. A neglected, but beautiful word is "reconcile"—to make friends again.

I recall at least two stories in the Bible where reconciliation took place after the passing of years. One involved the real-life situation of brothers, whose troubles began with favoritism by parents, but ended years later with an embrace in a field (Genesis 33:4-11). The other story was a parable told by our Lord, of a father and son—separated by a foolish choice, but reconnected by forgiveness (Luke 15:11-32).

Maybe you have your own story—and maybe it is time to reconnect..
