"MASTER THE TEMPEST IS RAGING"

When I was 5 or 6 years old, my father built a fishing cabin near the bay at Rockport, Texas.

It was a magical place! Mustang Island is about 20 miles away from Rockport and, in those days, was only accessible by boat. The State of Texas provided ferry service to the island. Port Aransas served as landing for travelers to the Island and became the



location of the small fishing village that has become a favorite vacation spot for many Texans.

On September 11, 1961, Hurricane Carla made landfall on the Texas Coast. We felt its affects in San Antonio. Port Aransas was devastated. The fishing cabin in Rockport was all but destroyed. Only 43 people died as a direct result of the storm, but considering the extent of damage, that seems miraculous.

There is a storm story in Mark 4:35-41. Mary A. Baker wrote a hymn based on the storm story recorded by Mark. Here is the first verse.

Master, The Tempest is Raging

"Master the tempest is raging! The billows are tossing high!
The sky is o'er-shadowed with blackness, no shelter or help is nigh;
Car-est Thou not that we perish? How canst thou lie asleep?
When each moment so madly is threat'ning a grave in the angry deep?"

In the second verse, she describes anguish of spirit and grief to its very depths. Then she voices the call to the Master to take control of the situation. When He takes control, "The terror is over!"
